Page 1 Makes a 1/8" long Barrel type bead. Paper Strip is 1/8" at the wide end and 1/16" at the narrow end.
Makes a 1/8" long Tube, Cone or Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 1/8" at the wide end and 1/8" at the narrow end.
Makes a 1/4" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 1/4" at the wide end and 1/16" at the narrow end.
Makes a 1/4" long Barrel type bead. Paper Strip is 1/4" at the wide end and 1/8" at the narrow end.
Makes a 1/4" long Tube, Cone or Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 1/4" at the wide end and 1/4" at the narrow end.
Makes a 3/8" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 3/8" at the wide end and 1/16" at the narrow end.
Makes a 3/8" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 3/8" at the wide end and 1/8" at the narrow end.
Makes a 3/8" long Barrel type bead. Paper Strip is 3/8" at the wide end and 1/4" at the narrow end.
Makes a 3/8" long Tube, Cone or Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 3/8" at the wide end and 3/8" at the narrow end.
Makes a 1/2" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 1/2" at the wide end and 1/16" at the narrow end.
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Makes a 1/2" long Tube, Cone or Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 1/2" at the wide end and 1/2" at the narrow end.
Makes a 5/8" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 5/8" at the wide end and 1/16" at the narrow end.
Makes a 5/8" long Bicone type bead. Paper Strip is 5/8" at the wide end and 1/8" at the narrow end.
Makes a 5/8" long Bicone type head. Paper Strip is 5/8" at the wide end and 1/4" at the parrow end

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Marking Template Instructions

These template Sheets are designed to be used with any paper that you want to mark and use to make paper beads. To print cutting lines directly on 8½" x 11" paper, you might want to purchase our cutting line templates! To use these marking templates, just lay your paper on the size bead ruler you want to use and mark your paper following the little lines across the ruler.

Step By Step

- 1. Lay the marking template on your work surface.
- 2.Lay the paper to be marked, on the marking template, of your choice.
- 3. With a pencil, mark each bead across your paper, moving your paper when you need to.
- 4. Turn your paper around and mark the opposite end using the same ruler.
- 5. Cut your strips using your favorite method and start rolling your beads!
- 6. Glaze your beads with your favorite glazing medium with your favorite glazing method.



Types of Beads

Each ruler is marked with the wide and narrow end of each strip to be cut and made into a bead.

Tube Shaped Beads

To make tube shaped beads, just mark your paper using the rulers that have the same sizes all the way across, so your strips are the same width at both ends.

Bicone Shaped Beads

To make a bicone bead from the rulers that say tube, bicone or bicone bead, just lay your paper half way on the first section to begin your marks. On the other end of the paper, start at the edge of the ruler on the edge of the paper. Make sure the narrow end is centered to the wide end of your strips.



Cone Shaped Beads

To make cone beds, cut strips as for tube beads but then cut the strips in half diagonally from one end to the other, that way, you have a 90degree angle at your wide ends. Another way to make a cone shaped bead is to cut your strips as for bicone beads. When you roll your strip, do not glue it until you reach the end of the strip. Then secure it, then push one end of the cone shape flat to form a cone.

Pandora Style Beads



You can make pandora style beads with any strips you want as long as you use the 3/16" paper bead roller so the 3/16" eyelets will fit inside the holes. The typical Pandora Style Beads, like the ones in the picture, were made by cutting a 3/8" tube strip, 3/8" x 1/4" strip and 1/4" x1/8" strips that were 11" long. Use Superglue when you insert your eyelets into the hole of the glazed beads. There is a complete tutorial on how to make Pandora Style Beads at PaperbeadCrafts.com.
