

Paper Shutter Block

Using the Quilt as You Piece Method

This is the 16th quilt block tutorial in a series on how to make quilt blocks using the Quilt as You Piece Method. This quilt block can be completely made in the Quilt as you Piece method.

Materials Needed

Makes one Block:

- * Fabric: Follow the diagram for the sizes. Cut double the number of pieces indicated for the front and back making sure the back pieces mirror the front pieces.
- * Batting Follow the diagram for the sizes making them bigger than indicated. Cut one piece of batting for each patch in the block.
- * Cotton Sewing thread in neutral color, 50wt preferred.
- * Washable Liquid Glue
- * Washable Glue Stick



Tools Needed

These are the tools I used. Use what you have.

- * Rotary Cutter & Cutting Mat
- * Pair of Fabric Scissors
- * Temporary Marking Device
- * 18"x3" quilt ruler
- * 10.5"x10.5" Square Ruler
- * Dry Iron & Pressing Board

Instructions

- 1. Follow the sizes for cutting your pieces but make pieces C and D bigger than indicated so you will have something to trim at the end.
- You can keep the batting pieces long if you like.They can be trimmed later.
- 3. Trim your batting as you go, after adding each piece and after quilting each piece.
- 4. Use the Quilt as You Piece method for all pieces. Quilt as you add each piece or

wait until the block is complete.


5. Trim to 10-1/2" x 10-1/2". Do stay stitching, an 1/8" in from the edges, all the way around.


I do not know if this block exists anywhere else. If it does, I do not know the actual name for it. This one came out of my head. If you know the actual name of this block, I would not mind changing it and giving credit where credit is

due.

Block Name & Design Disclaimer:

This pattern sheet just provides what materials you need and what size pieces you need to make a 10" block and in what order to sew the pieces of the block together. It does not go into complete detail how I put them together in the Quilt as You Piece manner, please refer to our tutorial of the Five Strip Rail Fence Block for the basic concept and instructions on how to do Quilt as You Piece for this block and all other blocks in this series.





Finished block measures 10 in. high and 10 in. wide

Fabric strips are 40 in. long

Numbers: Order of assembly.

Letters: Identify Patches.







Cut 1 - 3 7/8 in. wide strip Cut 1 square



Cut 1 - 4 1/8 in. wide strip Cut 2 triangles from 1 square



3 7/8 in. High by 7 1/4 in. Wide Polygon 2 Pieces





Cut 1 - 7 1/2 in. wide strip
Cut 2 triangles from 1 square
Cut this to 8" to make sure it is big enough

This template is not actual size. This is just to give you a guide to use for cutting out this patch.

Cut it to 8" x 4.5" and cut a 45° triangle at one end following the map above. Make sure to cut both the front and back side at the same
